AMERICA'S NIGHTMARE: *A dictator in the White House*

In nations around the world that have labored under the oppression of a socialist state and are now struggling to move toward a model of freedom and democracy, citizens and leaders alike are astonished to see that in America, the “last bastion of freedom,” a leftist *coup* has overtaken us. It is clear to them that President Obama’s actions are destroying the America that once existed. What is not clear to them is why we are allowing it to happen.

The Nightmare

Millions of Americans were stunned by the results of the November ‘08 election. They were the savvy ones who had figured Barack Obama out by relying on his own words, written and spoken during the years leading up to his nomination, during his Senate years, and during his presidential campaign. It was there for anyone to see. And those who did see could not understand how the most liberal member of the U.S. Senate, a Chicago politician and community organizer with radical-left connections but no real experience that would prepare him for the highest office in the land could have been elected. It was like a bad dream—a nightmare in which a weird spell sweeps over the land, rendering millions of American voters blind and mentally challenged (to put it kindly).

Seven months after the election, the nightmare persists, but it has steadily worsened. The economic damage that has been done through an uncontrolled orgy of spending could take decades to repair—if, in fact, we are fortunate enough to see a recovery. The American entrepreneurial spirit is being intentionally eroded; the blessings of prosperity have been snatched—perhaps permanently—from the 14+ million who are now jobless; the “can do” spirit is being re-channeled by the Left into a spirit of subservience and allegiance to the State; private sector companies are being seized and virtually run by the government; and the President—in a move to sidestep the system of checks and balances mandated by the Constitution and subvert the authority of Congress—continues to appoint “czars” (numbering 16 to date) who will formulate and implement government policy on health care, the economy, energy, and other important matters, even though they are un-elected and accountable to no-one but the resident.

The American dream of rewards for hard work and persistent effort is being systematically destroyed by Obama’s redistribution scheme. Alert Americans are seeing that this administration intends to take the fruits of their labors and distribute them to beneficiaries of *their* choice under a corrupt system of political spoils—just as happens in Banana Republics controlled by sleazy dictators who seize power through military *coups* and rigged elections.

My fellow citizens, how long will it take for those of you who still believe in Barack Obama’s empty mantra of “hope and change” to wake up? Every day, we hear from citizens of other nations who understand what has happened. They are baffled to see the most powerful of nations being brought to its knees by an arrogant but woefully unqualified Chicago politician—billed as “eloquent” and “gifted,” but unable to make a coherent address without the aid of a teleprompter. His poor grasp of history and his utter ignorance of economics have contributed to one of the most devastating—and unnecessary—financial catastrophes in the history of the world.

This woman “gets it”

Following are excerpts from an astonishingly perceptive article, “Obama, the African Colonial,” written by L.E. Ikenga, a black American woman born of Nigerian parents who emigrated to America in the 1970s. Her article was published at *The American Thinker* (www.americanthinker.com) on June 26, 2009.

First off, Ms. Ikenga tells us we should not have been so obsessed with candidate Obama's skin color; had we paid more attention to his cultural identity, he probably would not be in the White House today. She writes:

"Like many educated intellectuals in post-colonial Africa, Barack Hussein Obama, Sr., [Obama's father] was enraged at the transformation of his native land by its colonial conquerors. But instead of embracing the traditional values of his own tribal cultural past, he embraced an imported Western ideology, Marxism."

The name Ms. Ikenga uses to refer to such frustrated and angry modern Africans who embrace various foreign "isms" is "African Colonials," or AC, for short.

She continues: *the "African Colonial" is a person who, by means of their birth or lineage, has a direct connection with Africa. Their worldviews have been shaped not by the indigenous beliefs of a specific African tribe, but by the ideals of the European imperialism that dominated Africa during the colonial period.*

These people have no real allegiance to their specific African traditions or histories; rather, they "use aspects of their African culture as one would use pieces of costume jewelry: things of little or no value that can be thoughtlessly discarded when they become a negative distraction . . ."

"On the other hand, [they] strive to be the best at the culture that they inherited from Europe. Throughout the West, they are tops in their professions as lawyers, doctors, engineers, Ivy League professors . . . this is all well and good. It's when they decide to engage us as politicians that things become messy and convoluted."

The AC politician *"feigns revulsion towards the hegemonic paradigms of Western civilization. But at the same time, he is completely enamored of the trappings of its aristocracy or elite culture."*

He blames "whitey" for all that has gone wrong in the world and convinces the masses that various forms of African socialism are the best way to redress the problems that European colonialism created in Africa. However, in contrast to the hard-core African Leftist who "actually believes in something," the African Colonial uses socialist themes to disguise his true ambition: a ruthless power grab whereby the will of the people becomes completely irrelevant.

Like the imperialists of Old World Europe, the African Colonial politician sees his constituents as "a flock of ignorant sheep that need to be led," rather than as free thinking individuals who know best how to go about achieving and creating their own means for success.

"Like the European imperialist who spawned him, the AC politician is a destroyer of all forms of democracy," Ms. Ikenga writes. *"Barack Obama is all of the above. The only difference is that he is here playing (colonial) African politics as usual."*

A Blueprint for Destruction

Following are a few examples of tactics the British employed in order to create in 1914 what is now called Nigeria. The same tactics are now being used by Obama and company in order to achieve a complete takeover—i.e., one party government control of the United States for decades (if not generations) to come.

Divide and Conquer: Imperialists used this ancient strategy by pitting tribes against each other in order to create chaos, which they then blamed on ethnic rivalry. Barack Obama repeatedly introduced race as an issue during his campaign, and cleverly exploited as a campaign tool whatever remains of America's guilt over slavery. That is only one of many issues that Obama and company are using to pit one class of Americans against others.

Confiscate wealth and resources by any means necessary in order to redistribute wealth. This tactic was used by the imperialists to convince the people they wanted everyone to have a "fair shake;" but as Ms. Ikenga points out, *"Imperialists are not interested in equality for all. They are interested in **controlling** all."*

Convince the masses of your intellectual superiority—that your uppercrust university education naturally puts you on an intellectual plane from which to understand everything even when you understand nothing.

Lie to the people and tell them progress is being made, even though things are clearly getting worse.

Use every available media outlet to perpetuate the propaganda that you and your followers are the enlightened ones—and those who oppose you are barbaric, uncivilized, and ignorant. Ms. Ikenga closes by warning, *"Understand this: the African Colonial who is given too much political power can only become one thing: a despot."*

L.E. Ikenga is a first generation African-American woman, born of West African parents who emigrated to the U.S. in the 1970's from the country now known as Nigeria. She considers herself both a proud American and a proud Igbo, the tribal family from which she is descended.
