White House Propaganda Machine at Full Throttle Administration reports fake jobs in non-existent districts to enhance stimulus effects

Have you been hearing optimistic stories about jobs created through President Obama's \$787 billion economic stimulus?

The Heritage Foundation's "Morning Bell" column advises on November 17, 2009, that you should probably forget everything you've heard. There is mounting evidence that the administration's stimulus effort has been mired in waste, poor reporting and mismanagement.

The *Washington Examiner* has begun tracking stories from established media outlets on bogus job claims made by the Obama administration. At this writing, they have identified 75,343 fake jobs out of the 640,000 jobs that the Obama administration claims have been "saved" or "created." The *Washington Post* has reported that the Government Accountability Office found that almost 4,000 designated recipients of stimulus money reported they had created or saved more than 58,000 jobs- despite the fact they had not yet received stimulus funding. Another 9,200 recipients reported no job creation, despite having actually received a total of \$965 million in stimulus funds.

Responding to mounting criticism, the administration's Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board said on November 19 that their website, *Recovery.gov*, is "fixing errors" that show hundreds of millions of stimulus dollars spent, with a break-down of amounts received in each state's congressional districts. Down A Rabbit Hole?

If you have the patience to wade through the "data" on the government website *Recovery.gov* (which cost the tax payers 18 million to set up), you'll find dozens of Obama "stimulus success stories" from across the country. The assertion by the Obama administration is that in Minnesota's 57th Congressional District, 35 jobs have been saved or created using \$404,340 in stimulus funds; in New Mexico's 22nd Congressional District, 25 jobs have been saved or created using \$61,000 in stimulus cash. Arizona's data showed the state's 52nd, 15th, and 86th congressional districts received hundreds of thousands of dollars in stimulus money. This was according to CNN affiliate KNXV. However, no such congressional districts exist in Arizona, which has only eight congressional districts.

In fact, none of the above-mentioned Congressional Districts actually exist. Yet, those jobs "created or saved" claims still sit on the Obama administration's official "transparency and accountability" website.

It gets worse. The Franklin Center for Government & Public Integrity found more than \$6.4 billion in stimulus funds were shown as being spent- and more than 28,420 jobs saved or created- in 440 false districts. Defending phony data on his website, *Recovery.gov* Communications Director Ed Pound told ABC News: "We report that the recipients submit to us. Some recipients clearly don't know what congressional districts they live in, so they appear to be just throwing in any number. We expected all along that recipients would make mistakes on their congressional districts, on job numbers, on award amounts, and so on. Human beings make mistakes."

No kidding. But the problem with the phony *Recovery.gov* data is not human reporting error, as the administration wants us to believe. It's the fact that even highly trained professional economists don't have a clue as to how anyone could tell with any certainty that a job has been "saved or created." Nevertheless, the Obama administration expects a small business store owner in Kentucky who runs a shoe store, for example, to navigate through this snake oil swamp and come up with a number . . . any number.

Fortunately, we have an objective way to hold Obama accountable; and that is the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, which has been collecting accepted and standardized employment data since the 1940s.

When President Obama was selling his \$787 billion stimulus to the American people, he “sold” it on the promise that unemployment would never rise above 7.8% and that by 2010 the U.S. Economy would employ 138.6 million jobs. The unemployment rate is now 10.2% and there are only 130.8 million jobs in the U.S. economy, leaving President Obama 7.8 million jobs short of what he promised. Bottom Line: The American people cannot trust any stimulus claims coming out of the Obama White House propaganda machine.

But- not to worry. Vice-President Joe Biden appeared on Comedy Central’s “Daily Show” on November 17 and explained the errors did not indicate unaccounted for spending (“the rabbit hole”); but were, instead, the result of political ignorance. “There was [sic] bad civics classes” for those who reported the data, Biden said. “They had to fill out a form, what district are you in, and there was no such district”
