WILLFUL BLINDNESS

On March 5, 2010, Andrew C. McCarthy delivered a speech in Washington, D.C., as part of a lecture series sponsored by the Hillsdale College Center for Constitutional Studies and Citizenship. In that speech, which was entitled, “America’s War on Islamist Terror . . . Or Is It?” Mr. McCarthy made the following statements about the intent of the Framers of the Constitution with regard to our ability as a nation to defend ourselves:

“[The Framers of our Constitution] did not believe that we would be able to define our enemies out of existence by not uttering their names—or rationalize them out of existence by insisting that their hostility is somehow our own fault. Nor did the Framers believe that we would be able to indict our enemies into submission in our civilian Courts.”

Andrew McCarthy has an impressive grasp of what will be required for our nation to defend itself against terrorism. He served for 18 years as Assistant U.S. Attorney in the South District of New York; from 1933-95 he led the prosecution against Sheik Omar Abdel Rahman and 11 others in connection with the 1993 World Trade Center bombing. Following the 9/11 attacks, McCarthy supervised the Justice Department’s command post near Ground Zero. He also served as a Special Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense and an adjunct professor at Fordham University School of Law and New York Law School.

Mr. McCarthy writes widely for newspapers and journals, including *National Review*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and *USA Today*. He is author of the book, *Willful Blindness: A Memoir of the Jihad*.
